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SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Youth 420 Regatta

A Part of Nantucket Race Week

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1. **RULES**

- 1.1. The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. US Sailing Prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3. RRS 60.4(a)(2) is changed as follows: “(2) if it alleges a breach of a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 and is from a boat that was not involved in, and did not see, the incident, or”.
- 1.4. Appendix V1, PENALTY AT THE TIME OF AN INCIDENT will apply.

2. **CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 2.1. Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted at least 2 hours prior to the affected event on the [Official Notice Board](#) or verbally by the signal vessel prior to the warning signal.
- 2.2. The race committee may make changes on the water to the Sailing Instructions by hail to each boat before the warning signal in accordance with RRS 90.2(c).

3. **SCHEDULE**

- 3.1. The regatta will be sailed over two days: August 6 and 7, 2026.
- 3.2. There will be no competitors meeting. Coaches will verbally deliver instructions ahead of rigging at home clubs.
- 3.3. On Thursday, August 6, the first warning signal will be at 1300.
- 3.4. On Friday, August 7, the first warning signal will be at 1000.
- 3.5. No race will be started after 1530 on Thursday, August 6. No race will be started after 1430 on Friday, August 7.
- 3.6. Multiple races are planned each day.
- 3.7. Awards are scheduled at 1600 at Nantucket Yacht Club on Friday, August 7.

4. **RACING AREAS**

All races will be sailed in Area 1 or Area 2 as shown in Addendum A.

5. **COURSES**

The courses to be sailed are shown in Addendum B, including the approximate angles between legs and the order in which marks are to be passed. The courses will be hailed from the signal vessel or displayed on a white board.

6. **MARKS**

All marks for course will be red balls.

7. **THE START**

- 7.1. The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel at the starboard end and the course side of the port end starting mark.
- 7.2. Repeated short sound signals will be made approximately ten seconds before the warning signal. Before that action, the race committee will verbally hail all boats to inform them which Division, or Divisions (420 Open or 420 Green) will be in the upcoming starting sequence.
- 7.3. Races will use the Audible-Signal Racing System of Appendix U (3-minute dinghy starts).
- 7.4. The two 420 Divisions may be started separately or together.
- 7.5. Boats may not start more than 5 minutes after their starting signal.
- 7.6. If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line the race committee will attempt to hail the sail numbers of those boats after the starting signal. The failure to hail her number, failure to



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hear such a hail, and the order and timing of such hails, will not be considered an improper action or omission by the race committee under RRS 61.4(b)(1).

8. CHANGE IN THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

The course may be changed or shortened during racing without signaling at the previous mark. This changes RRS 33. The Race Committee will attempt to hail each boat.

9. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee vessel and the course side of the finishing mark.

10. TIME LIMIT

10.1. The time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish will be 45 minutes.

10.2. Boats still racing more than 10 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

11. SCORING

RRS A5.3 shall apply.

12. PROTESTS AND REDRESS

12.1. Boats shall immediately inform the boat they are protesting.

12.2. A boat intending to protest shall inform the race committee upon finishing.

12.3. Except as stated in SI 12.5, protests need not be written and will be heard using a "3-Minute Justice" system. This changes RRS 60.3

12.4. For protests for incidents involving serious damage or injury, the Protest Time Limit will be 45 minutes after the docking time of the Signal Boat.

12.5. Protests for incidents involving serious damage or injury shall be filed with the Protest Desk in writing before the Protest Time Limit, and a hearing will be conducted in accordance with RRS 63.

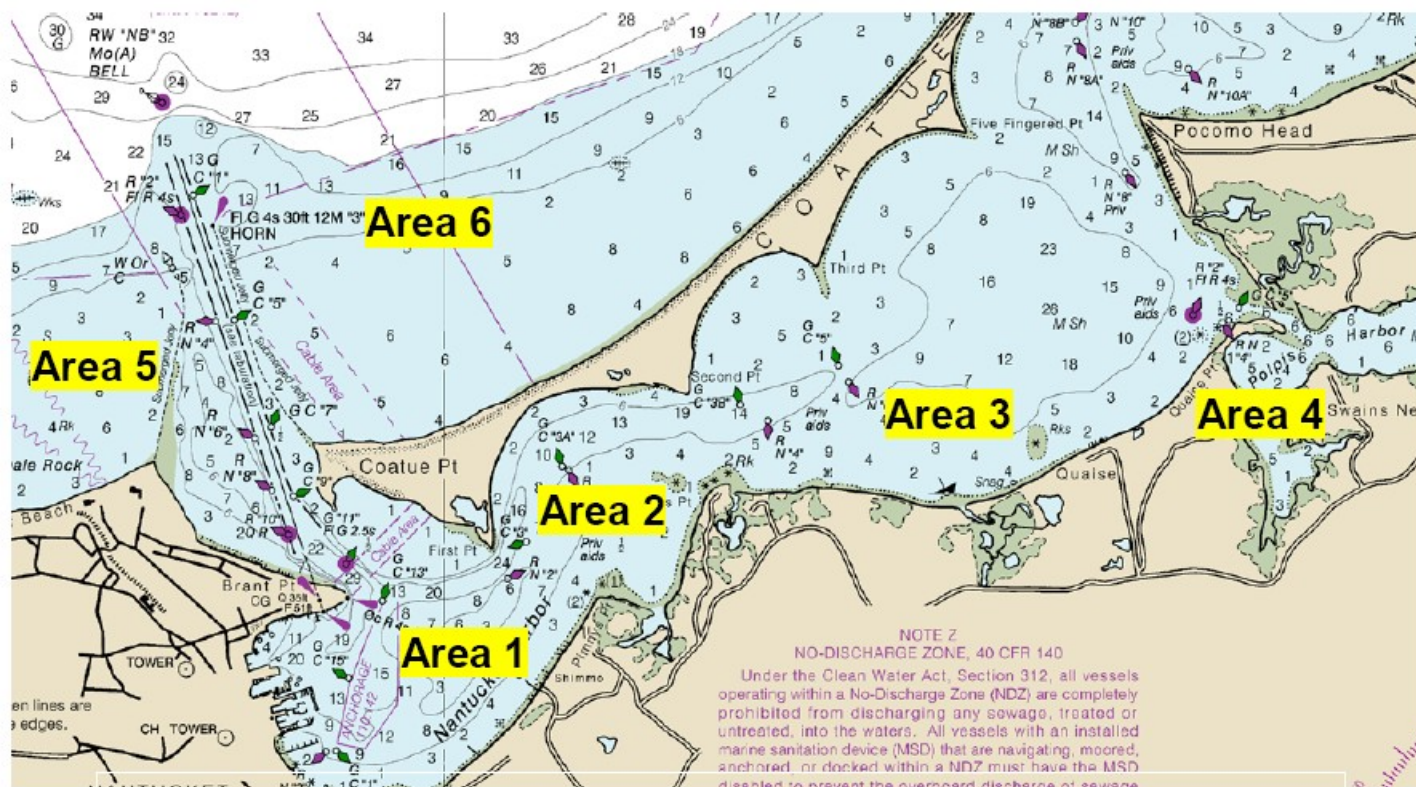
12.6. The Protest Desk will be located at the Nantucket Yacht Club.

13. SAFETY

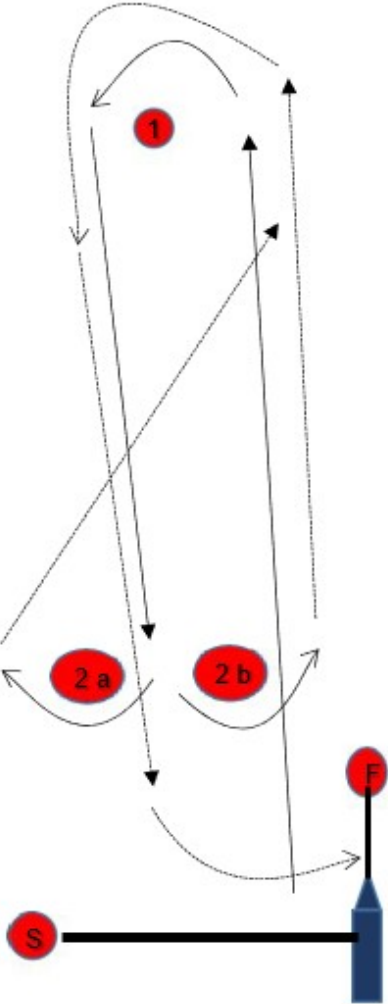
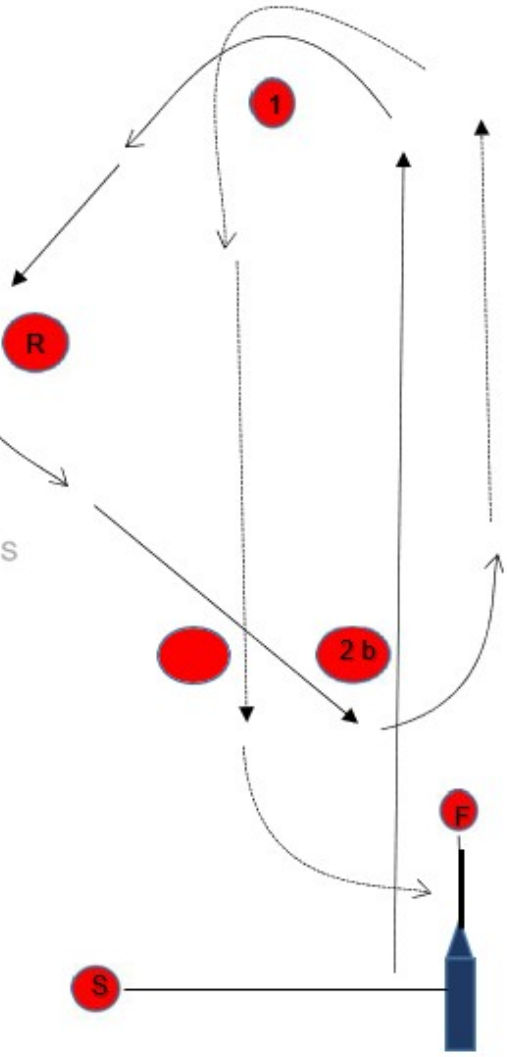
13.1. All boats shall check-in with the race committee before the start of the first race by sailing past the signal vessel on starboard tack and hailing their sail number and receiving confirmation from the race committee.

13.2. A boat that retires from the racing area shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.
