2026 NOTICE OF RACE

Execution Rocks Race

Friday, July 17, 2026

The Larchmont Yacht Club is the organizing authority (OA) of the event.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. RRS 60.4(a)(2) is changed to read: "(2) if it alleges a breach of a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 and is from a boat that was not involved in, and did not see, the incident, or".
- 1.3. The US Sailing prescription to RRS 63.1 will not apply.
- 1.4. The US Sailing prescription to RRS Appendix V (Alternative Penalties) will apply.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1. The sailing instructions (SI) will be available no later than 1700 on Friday, July 3, 2026 at yachtscoring.com.
- 2.2. Competitors may submit questions regarding the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions in writing to the Race Committee at sailing@larchmontyc.org. Questions and answers will be posted on the official notice board.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1. The official notice board is located online at yachtscoring.com.
- 3.2. [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on U.S. marine channels.
- 3.3. On the water, the Race Committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors via VHF radio. This channel will be stated in the SI.
- 3.4. [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. The event is open to boats with a valid YRALIS PHRF certificate. PHRF classes will be offered for both spinnaker and non-spinnaker configurations.
- 4.2. Boats without a valid PHRF certificate may be accepted at the discretion of the OA and assigned a rating based on the YRALIS distance rating for the same or a similar boat type.
- 4.3. Eligible boats may enter by registering online at yachtscoring.com no later than 2359 on Wednesday, July 15, 2026. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the OA.
- 4.4. To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

5. FEES

The entry fee is ~~\$150~~ \$25 and includes daily post-race social events for the entire crew.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1. There is no competitors' briefing scheduled.
- 6.2. The race is scheduled for Friday, July 17, 2026.
- 6.3. The intended time of the first warning signal is 1830.

7. VENUE

Racing will take place in and around Larchmont Harbor.

8. COURSE

The race will be a short-distance coastal race using government marks. The start will be in the vicinity of the Larchmont Breakwater and the finish will be in the vicinity of Hen & Chickens Rock. Marks of the course may include those in the vicinity of Larchmont Harbor, Prospect Point, Execution Rocks, and Hart Island. The courses will be described in the SI.

9. SCORING

9.1. A boat in a handicapped class will have its corrected time calculated using the Time-on-Time method, using the following ratings:

9.1.1. PHRF spinnaker: Spin. Dis. rating;

9.1.2. PHRF non-spinnaker: N-Spin. Dis. Rating.

10. {RESERVED}

11. GUEST MOORINGS

Complimentary guest moorings will be available from July 10 through July 20 on a first-come, first-served basis. Reservations shall be made in advance by completing the [online form](#) and are subject to confirmation. Standard guest mooring rates apply outside this period. 12. RIGHT TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

By participating in this event, competitors grant the Organizing Authority the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and display any photography, audio, and video recordings, and other reproductions of them or their boat taken at the venue or on the water, for editorial or promotional purposes, without compensation. Competitors waive any right to inspect or approve such materials.

13. RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.

14. PRIZES

14.1. Prizes will be awarded on Friday, July 17, 2026 at the LYC Front lawn, as soon as possible after racing, to boats placing first, second, and third overall for best corrected time, and to the boat with the shortest elapsed time.

14.2. A boat that sets an elapsed time "long course" record will receive a case of Mt. Gay rum. This will be awarded at the Race Week awards ceremony on Sunday, July 19, 2026. The current elapsed time record for the long course is 1:00:48, set by *Sundari* on July 21, 2019.
